Abiquiú Pueblo was founded in 1754 as a settlement populated by people of mixed Native American and Spanish ancestry. Abiquiu means "wild chokecherry place" in the Tewa language. The pueblo often hosted trade fairs to which tribes brought hides, meat and captive children to trade with the Spanish. Now the Genizaro people of Abiquiú have a profound sense of community and are proud to have lived on this beautiful land for nearly 300 years.


